MONTH AT GLANCE

During the month of March, the Neighborhood Coyote Program continued to document reports and share relevant information to residents who reported coyote activity in their neighborhoods.

As the spring season arrives, we must also prepare for the onset of coyote denning and pupping season. Over the next few months, there will be a noticeable uptick in coyote activity within the vicinity. Coyotes will be on the lookout for sources of shelter, food and water. It is important that we take all the necessary measures to safeguard our domesticated pets. It is highly advised that pets be walked on a leash that spans no more than six feet away from their owners. To those who like cats who like to be outdoors, may want to contemplate constructing a catio. Additionally, when embarking on walks, it would be helpful to bring along a means of defense against coyotes, such as a flashlight, projectiles like stones or any object that generates a loud noise, such as an airhorn.

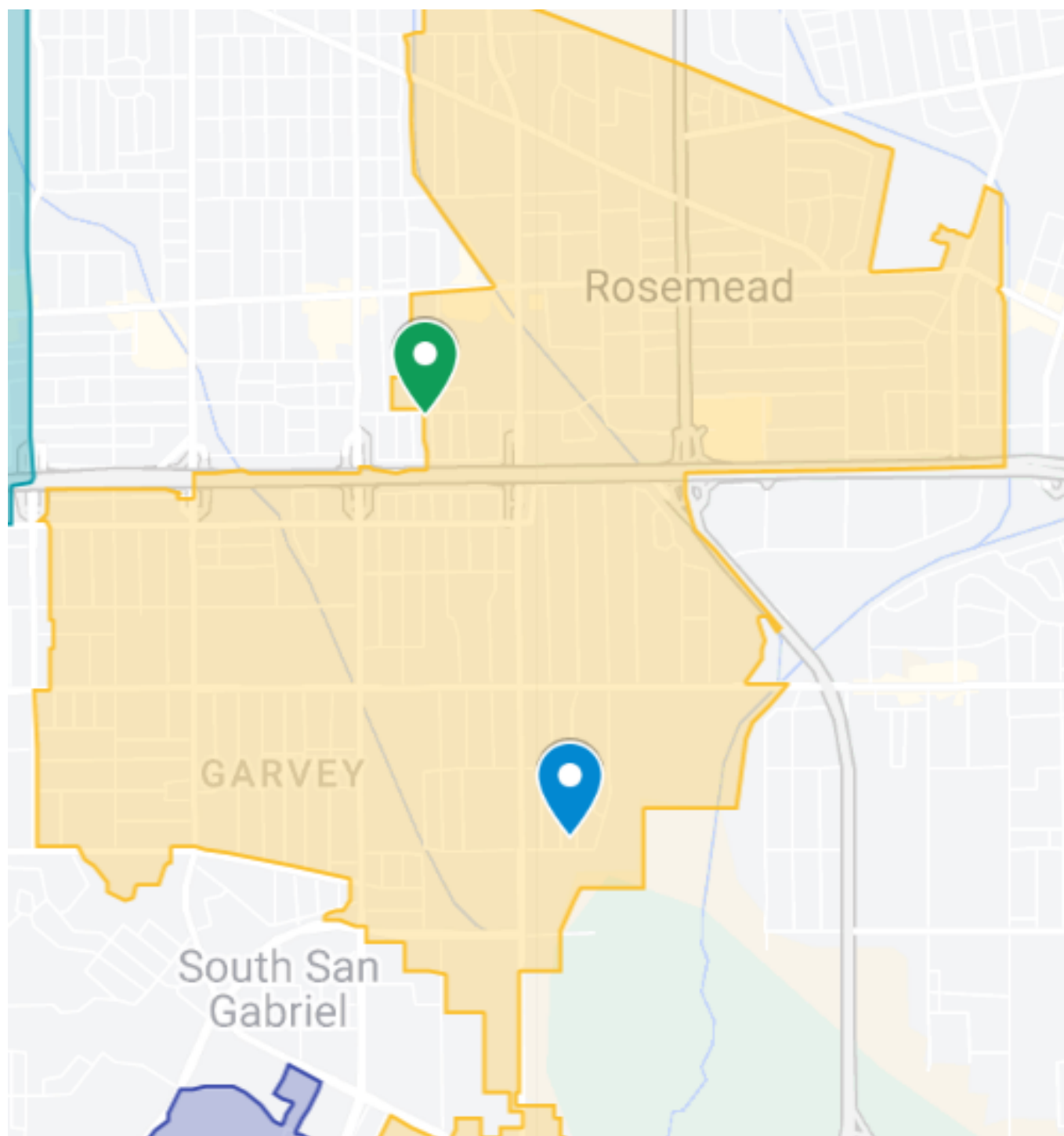
