# **MONTH AT GLANCE**

During the month of November, the Neighborhood Coyote Program continued to document reports and share relevant information to residents who reported coyote activity in their neighborhoods.

This month, coyote sightings increased across member cities. As a reminder, coyotes are active at all times of the day but are most commonly spotted at dusk or dawn. They roam throughout neighborhoods in search of food, water and shelter. Coyotes are frequently seen in more natural areas within the city, such as parks and nurseries. They can also be found near washes and foothill communities. In light of this, it is important that residents help keep the neighborhood safe by removing all sources of food and water, clearing overgrown foliage in backyards, and hazing coyotes that come near humans.


#### REPORT MAP
