During the month of January, the Neighborhood Coyote Program continued to document reports and share relevant information with residents who reported coyote activity in their neighborhoods.

As January comes to a close, coyote breeding season is just around the corner. During this season (February through March), coyote presence in urban neighborhoods may increase as coyotes search for food, shelter, and mates. To prevent coyotes from lingering in your neighborhood, continue to remove all attractants. If coyotes are still living within close proximity to your home, consider implementing deterrents. 
