## **MONTH AT GLANCE**

During the month of July, the Neighborhood Coyote Program continued to document reports and share relevant information to residents who reported coyote activity in their neighborhoods.

This month, we'd like to share some fun facts about coyotes! Did you know that coyotes have lived in LA county for several years? Coyotes can be identified by their long snout, bushy tail, and pointy ears. Adults weigh an average of ~25lbs. Coyotes tend to stay in areas where they can easily find food, water, and shelter, so it's important to not leave any food/water bowls outdoors. Coyotes are omnivores, and their diet varies from fruits and vegetables found in residents' yards to rodents and small mammals.


