During this fall season, consider taking earlier walks and carrying a flashlight with you to avoid walking in the dark. Coyotes are commonly spotted during times when it is dark and quiet. In October, when Halloween parties are happening every weekend, remember to not leave any type of food sources, including candy, outdoors to prevent coyotes and any other kinds of wildlife from entering your property. Trick or treating is for kids, not wildlife!


